This engaging and interactive game is designed to guide you through the journey of creating a rural development initiative in youth work. The puzzle pieces you'll work with represent key elements, from personal motivation to building a team and understanding your target group. Let's learn more.....

SETUP

Gather a group of individuals interested in rural youth development. Ensure diversity in skills and perspectives to enrich the collaborative process.

OBJECTIVE

Work together with your team to assemble the puzzle pieces, each representing a crucial element in developing a Rural Youth Development Initiative. From personal motivation to understanding target groups and building a team, your collective efforts will shape a well-rounded and impactful initiative.

MATERIALS

Prepare a set of puzzle cards representing different phases of the initiative. There should be enough space on the front side for a small visualisation by each participant. On the back part, prepare questions for discussion among participants. Provide writing materials for participants to jot down thoughts and ideas.

HOW TO PLAY?

Introduction:

Begin with a brief introduction to the Policy Puzzle and its goal of creating a Rural Youth Development Initiative.

Step 1: Motivation and Passion:

- Distribute Cards 1 to 5 among participants.
- Allow time for participants to fill in the cards individually. Facilitate a discussion on the contents of each card.
- Encourage sharing stories and experiences to build connections.

Step 2: How to Get Followers and Your Team:

- Distribute Cards 1 to 5 among participants.
- Allow time for participants to fill in the cards individually. Facilitate a discussion on the contents of each card.
- Explore creative ideas for building a motivated and effective team.

Step 3: Understanding Your Target Groups:

- Distribute Cards 1 to 5 among participants.
- Allow time for participants to fill in the cards individually. Facilitate a discussion on the contents of each card.
- Encourage participants to share their insights and thoughts.

Step 4: Discuss

- Discuss how individual contributions align to form a holistic initiative.
- Facilitate a reflection session where participants share their thoughts on the assembled initiative.
- Discuss potential strengths, areas for improvement, and the overall impact.

HOW TO DESIGN YOUR CARDS

 Before you start a game, design 15 cards (paper or any other appropriate material) so that you will have a front and back part. The front part should have space for visualisations, and the back should have enough space to write questions.

CARDS FOR THE STEP 1: MOTIVATION AND PASSION

- Card 1: Motivation Meter
- Front Part: Visualize your motivation meter, ranging from low to high motivation.
- Back Part: Write down the main reasons motivating you to be part of this initiative.

Card 2: Pitching Your Passion

Front Part: Visualize a speaker in a hall with many people.

Back Part: Craft a concise and compelling elevator pitch that conveys your passion and the initiative's mission.

Card 3: Navigating Networks

Front Part: Illustrate a tree with branches.

Back Part: List local communities, organisations, or online platforms where potential team members may be present. Identify potential collaborators.

Card 4: Recruiting with Purpose

Front Part: Illustrate a spider web.

Back Part: Specify individuals' roles and how their contributions will contribute to achieving goals.

Card 5: Goal-Oriented Path

Front part: Visualise a podium with winners and their medals

Back part: Define roles and contributions to achieving goals. Clearly state both short-term and long-term objectives for the initiative.

CARDS FOR THE STEP 2: HOW TO GET FOLLOWERS AND YOUR TEAM?

Card 1: Attracting Followers

Front Part: Visual representation of a magnet pulling in followers.

Back Part: Highlight potential benefits, communicate values, and articulate what makes your initiative stand out.

Card 2: Heart Connection

Front Part: An illustration of a heart symbolising your personal connection to the cause.

Back Part: Share a personal story or experience connecting you emotionally to the community's needs.

Card 3: Passion Flames

Front Part: Representative visual flames indicating your passion intensity.

Back Part: Envision the long-term impact of your efforts in the community.

Card 4: Goal Compass

Front Part: Visual representation of a compass pointing Towards a goal.

Back Part: List specific short-term goals for the next three months and plan a small celebration for achieving a milestone.

Card 5: Commitment Seal

Front Part: Visualize a symbolic seal representing commitment.

Back Part: Draft a personal commitment statement and physically sign and date the card as a tangible commitment.

CARDS FOR THE STEP 3: UNDERSTANDING YOUR TARGET GROUPS

Card 1: Walk in Their Shoes

Front Part: Design a wardrobe with shoes inside.

Back Part: Reflect on the challenges and aspirations of the target group. Incorporate visual elements that evoke empathy.

Card 2: Understanding Personas

Front Part: Make a sketched illustration of people.

Back Part: Share anonymised personal stories that capture the essence of the target group's experiences.

Card 3: Snapshot Moment

Front Part: Design the solution to impact the target group.

Back Part: Summarize key solutions to address the target group's challenges. Use icons or symbols for visual representation.

Card 4: Hands Working Together

Front Part: Sketch humans holding hands.

Back Part: Describe how the initiative will involve the target group in design and decision-making processes.

Card 5: Celebrating Achievements

Front Part: Visualize fireworks.

Back Part: Describe how the initiative will adapt based on feedback. Outline how achievements will be celebrated.
